Michael E. Brown is the Dean of the Elliott School of International Affairs and Professor of Political Science and International Affairs at The George Washington University. He has held these positions since August 2005.

Before coming to GW, Dean Brown held senior positions at Georgetown University's School of Foreign Service, Harvard University's Kennedy School of Government, and the International Institute for Strategic Studies in London. He was Co-Editor of *International Security*, the leading academic journal in the security studies field, for twelve years.

He is the author of *Flying Blind: The Politics of the U.S. Strategic Bomber Program*, which won the Edgar Furniss National Security Book Award. He is the editor or co-editor of 21 books, including: *Grave New World: Security Challenges in the 21st Century*, *Going Nuclear: Nuclear Proliferation and International Security in the 21st Century*, and four books focused on Asian security issues.

Dean Brown received his Ph.D. in Government from Cornell University. He has traveled to more than 70 countries.
