Another Marx: New Perspectives After the New Historical-Critical Edition of his Writings

Marx's thought has returned to the limelight in recent years. Faced with a new crisis of capitalism, many scholars are again looking to an author who was consigned it to oblivion after 1989. Marx's writings are presently being published under the auspices of the *Marx-Engels-Gesamtausgabe* (MEGA²) project. The picture that emerges from MEGA² is of an author who left a large part of his writings unfinished, in order to engage until his death in further studies. At a time when Marx's ideas have finally been liberated from the chains of Marxism-Leninism, Musto will present a more faithful account of the genesis of Marx's thought.

Marcello Musto teaches Sociology and Political Theory at York University (Toronto). He has been a recipient of German, Dutch, Italian, Danish, Norwegian, Canadian, Chinese and Japanese research fellowships and has delivered lectures and papers in numerous countries, including USA, Mexico, Chile, Argentina, Finland and South Korea. He is the editor of the volumes: *Karl Marx's Grundrisse: Foundations of the Critique of Political Economy 150 Years After* (Routledge: 2008), *Marx for Today* (Routledge: 2012); and the author of *Rethinking Marx and Marxisms* (Palgrave: forthcoming 2014). His books, articles and chapters in collective volumes (more than 100) have been published in 16 languages.
