One Century of Government and Laws at HKU




The study of Government and Laws at The University of Hong Kong (HKU) harks back to 1924, when the Cambridge-educated jurist George Keeton LLD FBA (1902–1989) became the inaugural Lecturer of Political Science and Jurisprudence and later Reader in Law and Politics at HKU.

During Professor Keeton's stint at HKU, the future Dean of Laws and Vice-Provost of University College London (UCL) and heroic anti-Nazi intellectual proposed the creation of a 5-year double degree programme in political science and law. He co-established with his HKU students an academic society and a student-edited academic journal on law and public affairs of the highest standard, copies of which were circulated in university libraries across the world,

illuminating topics ranging from ancient customary law to traditional Chinese law to the latest legal reforms in Europe.

Keeton's departure from Hong Kong in 1927 and all the chaos in the lead-up to the Second World War resulted in a premature end to all of the eminent jurist's visionary initiatives. In 1972, Keeton returned to HKU to be honoured with a Doctor of Laws (LLD) degree.

In 1999, one decade after his death, his vision was fulfilled when the Bachelor of Social Sciences (Government and Laws) and Bachelor of Laws Double Degree Programme (GLaws) opened its doors to some of the brightest students from Hong Kong and beyond.

Interdisciplinary Curriculum

Our curriculum blends core courses with an extensive set of disciplinary electives tailored to students' individual interests and professional aspirations. Our elective offerings expand every year, introducing new courses that engage with emerging issues in government and laws globally. Our curriculum is distinguished by its interdisciplinary focus, tying political science and law into one cohesive academic experience and exposing students to specialised courses that address the intersection between these two fields.

GLaws students enjoy the flexible option of graduating with a BSocSc (Govt & Laws) degree in 4 years, or a BSocSc (Govt & Laws) degree plus an LLB degree in 5 years. They are entitled to make an informed choice on whether to pursue the 4-year Track or the 5-year Track at the end of their second year. Students completing the 5-year Track are entitled to apply for a place on a Postgraduate Certificate in Laws (PCLL) programme, a prerequisite for legal practice in Hong Kong.

Whether delving into cutting-edge political science research or tackling real-world legal cases, our education embodies the seamless integration of theory and practice. At GLaws, governance is not merely studied in textbooks—it's lived through hands-on experimentation and implementation.

Research Opportunities

Students enjoy abundant opportunities to engage in academic research. They can serve as research assistants to professors on projects exploring such topics as China's growing global influence and the intersection of law and AI; act as editors for academic journals; or undertake their own research projects under faculty supervision. HKU hosts numerous research institutes that offer research opportunities, including the Centre for Medical Ethics and Law and the Centre on Contemporary China and the World.

Clinical Legal Education

The Faculty of Law's Clinical Legal Education programme offers students the chance to handle real cases under the supervision of experienced duty lawyers. This immersive experience empowers students to apply legal principles to real-world issues while developing essential lawyering skills such as client interviewing.

Mooting Competitions

The Faculty of Law offers students ample opportunities to hone advocacy skills. They can compete in internal mooting events or represent HKU at prestigious international competitions, such as the Philip C. Jessup International Law Moot Court Competition, showcasing their expertise on the global stage.

HKU LAW

Founded in 1969 as the Department of Law, the Faculty of Law is Hong Kong's oldest law school, distinguished for producing exceptional legal professionals, including the current Chief Justice of the Court of Final Appeal and the Secretary for Justice.

Programme Directors

Professor Hui LI is Director (Politics and Public Administration) and Assistant Professor at the Department of Politics and Public Administration. Her research focuses on public and nonprofit management, collaboration, civil society and governance, and civic engagement—issues that link nonprofits and non-governmental organisations (NGOs) to the policy process.

Professor Peter CHAU, '06 is Director (Law) and Associate Professor at the Faculty of Law. His research focuses on criminal law and sentencing, but he is interested in theoretical issues arising in many other branches of law as well. He teaches Criminal Law, Equity and Trusts, and Legal Theory.

Professor Trevor T. W. WAN, '22 is Director (Law) and Assistant Professor at the Faculty of Law. His research harnesses interdisciplinary approaches drawn mainly from political science, among other fields, to study comparative constitutional and administrative law, law of coroners and inquests, and legal medicine.

Government and Laws Committee HKU (GLC) is the flagship student-led experiential learning initiative of GLaws.

Bringing together students, practitioners, and experts from all over the world, GLC promotes robust debates about cutting-edge legal and policy issues at both international and domestic levels. GLC has held numerous seminars featuring real-time discussions with the most prominent jurists and public servants across the globe, including a former Chief Justice of Canada, a former Chief Justice of Australia, a former President of the International Criminal Court, a former Vice President of the International Court of Justice, and a former Vice President of the European Court of Human Rights. As the sole official student community of GLaws, GLC has organised induction activities for 8 GLaws cohorts, together consisting of more Canada; Lord Neuberger of Abbotsbury, former than 400 freshers.

Since 2018, GLC has published over 1,200 pages of high-quality content on law and public affairs

in no fewer than 2 dozen issues of Public Jurist, the official student magazine of GLaws; and 3 volumes of Hong Kong Journal of Public Affairs, now recognised as a student-edited journal of the Faculty of Law by the Faculty's official Legal Scholarship Blog. Contributors to Public Jurist hail from world-leading universities such as Harvard, Cambridge, and the National University of Singapore, among many others.

Additionally, GLC publications feature interviews with pre-eminent leaders in law and public affairs, including Lord Hoffmann, Non-Permanent Judge of the Hong Kong Court of Final Appeal; Hon. Beverley McLachlin, former Chief Justice of President of the United Kingdom Supreme Court; and Professor Pascal Lamy, former Director of the World Trade Organization.

Local candidates applying with results from the Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education (HKDSE) Examination are assessed based on the scores of their **best six subjects**. All elective subjects must be from Category A subjects. The minimum entrance requirements are outlined below.



For applicants with more than one sitting of the HKDSE, only the best results from the 2025 and 2026 sittings will be considered.



There are **no** interviews for JUPAS applicants.

NON-JUPAS ADMISSIONS | NJ6810

Applications based on qualifications other than the HKDSE, including the International Baccalaureate (IB) and GCE A-level, will be assessed on individual merits, taking into account, among others, academic records, personal statements, and referees' reports. Shortlisted candidates **may** be invited for an interview.
